

**SCHOOL GOAL #1:**

School Goal : Planned Improvement in English-Language Arts

52 percent of students in grades 3-5 will meet or exceed standard in ELA on the 2017 CAASPP Test.

**Data Used to Form this Goal:**

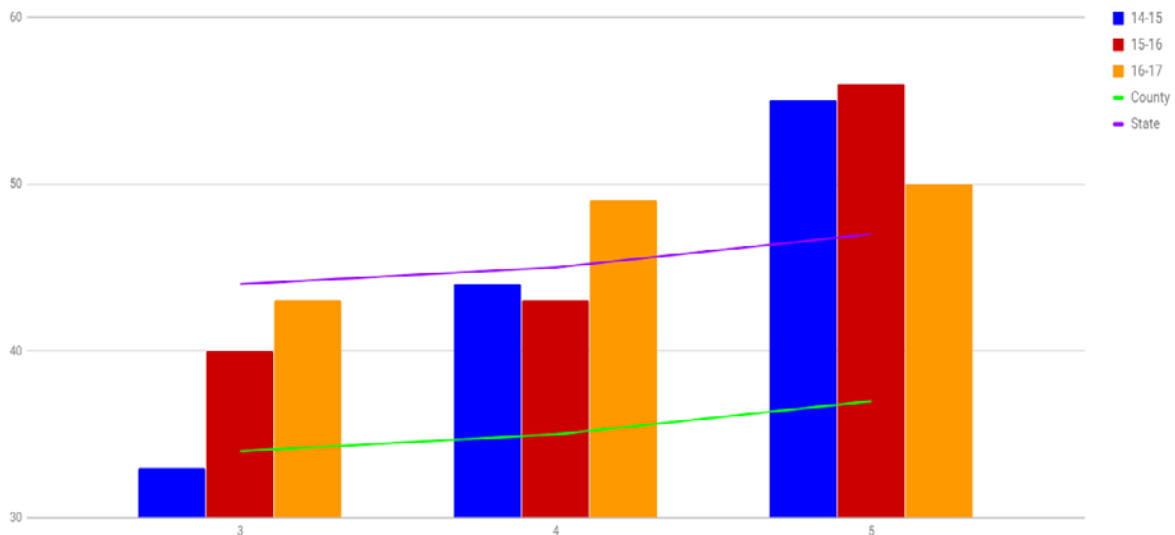
Performance on the CAASPP in ELA last year had 47 percent of students who met or exceeded standard; thus we are targeting 5 percentage points higher than last year's scores.

**Past Findings from the Analysis of this Data:**

Comparative data shows that Northmead has the best overall scores in the district on the CAASPP in ELA again this year. Data shows an increase of students who met or exceed standard from the previous year. One should note that the percentage of students scoring met or exceeded standard has risen across the district, county, and state. However,

Northmead was still 8 points higher than district average, 6 points higher than county average, and within 2 points of the state average.

Overall, the data supports that Northmead has continued to improved along with the state, county, and other elementary schools in the district.

In 2016 we were at 47 percent overall and the goal was to get to 52 percent; we are now at 47.29

**Evaluation:**

We did not make our goal set in ELA last year. With little difference in scores from last year it is hard to make assumptions in any given area. Thus comparison data to other schools is needed. Looking at this we see that every individual grade level is still exceeding the county average and most are exceeded the state average. This is remarkable. Third grade at Northmead is at 43.29, the county is 33.90, and the state is at 43.90. Fourth grade at Northmead is 48.54, the county it is at 35.89, the state is at 45.06. Fifth grade at Northmead is at 50.65, the county is at 37.09, the state is at 46.54. This illustrates our strategies, such as learning lab, are effective. This also indicates that while we did not see a big growth we are still performing well overall.

School Goal : Planned Improvement in Mathematics

39 percent of students in grades 3-5 will met or exceed standard in math on the 2017 CAASPP Test.

**Data Used to Form this Goal:**

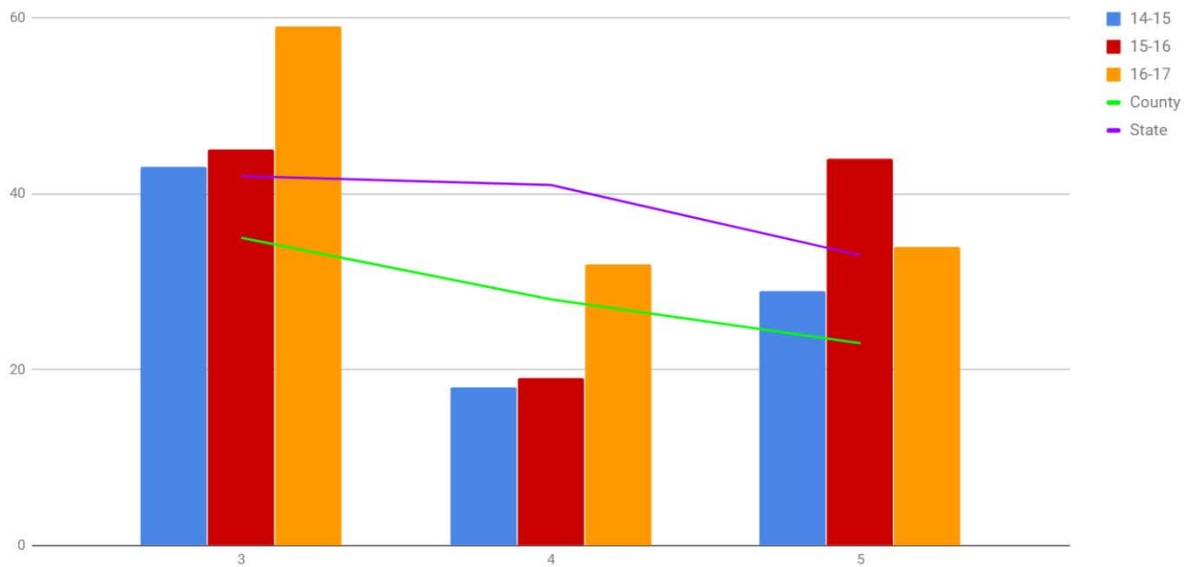
We set this Math goal by looking at the CAASPP scores. Overall we were at 34 percent who met the target and thus we set the goal for 5 percent higher.

**Past Findings from the Analysis of this Data:**

Comparative data shows that Northmead has the best overall scores in the district on the CAASPP in mathematics again this year. Data shows an increase of students who met or exceed standard from the previous year. One should note that the percentage of students scoring met or exceeded standard has risen across the district, county, and state.

However, Northmead was still 12 points higher than district average, 8 points higher than county average, and within 4 points of the state average .

Overall, the data supports that Northmead has continued to improved along with the state, county, and other elementary schools in the district.

In 2016 we were at 34percent overall and the goal was 39 percent; we are at 44.44 percent overall.

**Evaluation:**

We exceeded this goal of reaching 39 percent from 34 percent last year; leaping to 44.44 percent overall. Comparison data shows that every individual grade level is still exceeding the county average and most are exceeded the state average. This is remarkable. Third grade at Northmead is at 59.18, the county is 37.39, and the state is at 46.83. Fourth grade at Northmead is 31.73, the county it is at 28.15, the state is at 40.45. Fifth grade at Northmead is at 42.86, the county is at 23.24, the state is at 33.83. This proves we are growing and the PD offered to teachers through the district and SCOE was highly effective. It also proves the manipulatives purchased and dedicated time for collaboration was effective uses of monetary resources.

We used subgroup results from 2016 CAASPP test to form our goal. We looked at how EL students did compared to the county average. (Northmead is the first number)

**Data Used to Form this Goal:**

A 2014-2015 CA Healthy Kids Survey which 78 % of students responded that they felt very safe at school; up from 48 % in 2010- 2011.

**Past Findings from the Analysis of this Data:**

This survey is done every two years, and was re-administered last year. This data showed an increase in students feeling safe at school, which was our goal in the SPSA, but a decrease in expectations and caring relationship. Both of these areas, when looking closer, had a small amount reporting low.
